Characteristics of Effective Teaching and Learning:



At the heart of all practise within the Early Years is a focus on developing each child's skills as learners.

- **Playing and exploring:** Children investigate and experience things, and 'have a go'
- **Active learning:** Children concentrate and keep on trying if they encounter difficulties, and enjoy achievements
- **Creating and thinking critically:** Children have and develop their own ideas, make links between ideas, and develop strategies for doing things



Areas of Learning:

There are 7 areas. All areas are connected to one another and are important.

PRIME:

- Communication and language
- Physical development
- Personal, social and emotional development

SPECIFIC:

- Literacy
- Mathematics
- Understanding the world
- Expressive arts and design

Nursery session includes:

- Fine motor skills and social activities
- Five-minute Maths
- Focussed adult led learning
- Rhyme Time
- Independent play, including outside time
- Phonics
- Story time using our key text

LUNCH TIME



Rolling snack:

- Children are offered a healthy snack in school which is available throughout the morning and afternoon
- They build up food preparation skills by cutting and spreading as well as lots of talk around healthy eating
- We provide seasonal activities such as making pancakes

Maximising your child's potential:

- Being on time for school every day
- Regular attendance, avoiding term time holiday
- Establishing good routines at home
- Showing a positive interest in your child's learning
- Encouraging your child to take risks and experience failure so they develop perseverance and resilience

- An online learning journal system
- Staff record children's progress and activities using iPads
- Photos, videos and observations are uploaded onto an online app regularly
- Share your child's home learning and achievements
