Pupil Premium and Free School Meals

If you are in receipt of any of the following: Universal Credit, Income Support, Income Based Jobseeker's Allowance, Child Tax Credit with income below £16,190, Pension Credit (Guarantee Credit element), Working Tax Credit, Employment Support Allowance (income related) your child may qualify for additional funding which we can use to provide opportunities for your child such as additional classroom support, sport coaching, music tuition, uniform assistance and assistance with school trips.

The school can apply on your behalf if you contact the school office. Any information that you disclose as part of the application process will be treated in confidence. Alternatively, if you would like to apply yourself, you can do so <u>here:</u>

Hertfordshire County Council require anyone who was in receipt of Free School Meals during Early Years and Key Stage 1 to reapply when their child starts Year 3.

Attendance

We urge you not to take your child out of school for holidays; these absences are always unauthorised – even when tagged on to the start and end of term - and could result in a fixed penalty notice being issued for non-attendance.

These attendance figures include illness, as well as authorised and unauthorised absences. Even if your child is unwell, it is classed as an absence and contributes towards their attendance figures.
