

Ready to Progress: Year 1

Number and Place Value

I can count to and across 100, forwards and backwards, starting from any number.

I can count, read and write numbers to 100 in numbers.

I can count in jumps of twos, fives and tens.

I can tell you one more and one less than a number.

I can use objects and pictures to show the value of numbers.

I can compare numbers using words such as equal to, more than, less than (fewer), most and least.

I can read and write numbers from 1 to 20 in numbers and words.

Addition and Subtraction

I can read, write and understand maths sentences involving adding (+), subtracting (-) and the equals (=) signs.

I can show that I know number bonds and subtraction facts within 20.

I can add and subtract one-digit and two-digit numbers to 20, including zero.

I can solve simple number problems involving adding and subtracting using objects and pictures.

I can solve missing number problems such as $7 = \underline{\hspace{2cm}} - 9$ using objects and pictures to help.

Multiplication and Division

I can solve simple problems involving multiplying or dividing using objects, pictures and arrays with help.

Fractions

I can recognise, name and find halves of objects, shapes and numbers.

I can recognise, name and find quarters of objects, shapes and numbers.

Measurement

I can compare, describe and solve problems for lengths and heights, using words such as long/short, longer/shorter, tall/short, double/ half.

I can compare, describe and solve problems for mass and weight, using words such as heavy/light, heavier than, lighter than.

I can compare, describe and solve problems for capacity and volume, using words such as full/empty, more than, less than, half, half full, quarter.

I can compare, describe and solve problems for time, using words such as quicker, slower, earlier, later.

I can measure and begin to record lengths and heights.

I can measure and begin to record mass and weight.

I can measure and begin to record capacity and volume.

I can measure and begin to record time in hours, minutes and seconds.

I can recognise and know the value of different coins and notes.

I can put events in time order, using words such as before and after, next, first, today, yesterday, tomorrow, morning, afternoon and evening.

I can recognise and use words relating to dates, including days of the week, weeks, months and years.

I can tell the time to the hour and half past and draw the hands on a clock face to show these times.

Geometry

I can recognise and name common 2D shapes, such as rectangles, squares, circles and triangle.

I can recognise and name common 3D shapes, such as cuboids, cubes, pyramids and spheres.

I can talk about position, direction and movement, including whole, half, quarter and three-quarter turns.
